Committee Reports:

- Taylor Head Park- Warren reported that the brush has been cut back, improvements to the road, and work has been done on the trails. He reminded us that it is closer to park on the Old Taylor Head Road if you want to walk to the beach after the gates close. He will write a letter to the Minister to thank him for all his assistance with the improvements to the park.
- Marina/Moorings- Cathy reported that the sites may have to be surveys. The application is now on MLA Lloyd Hines's desk for approval. Alex Cope, Band Manager is planning a meeting with band members from Sheet Harbour/Beaverdam to discuss the possibility of the Marina at the Sheet Harbour wharf.
- **Sheet Harbour Port Authority** There has been an increase in traffic and anticipating more. Hopefully a boat will be in every six weeks.
- WITAP/Tourism No formal report, slow right now but an application has been submitted for funding for stage two
- Business Committee The present courses will be completed at the end of November. It was decided to have a winder class on Web Site Design. The class will take place on Monday either from 10- 2 or 11-3. Financial Planning and Accounting may be the courses offered in the spring. The winter class has 6 signed up for it therefore 6 more seats are available. Some discussion took place around what to do with the money that is generated from the courses, \$1000 each. This will be discussed further at a later date.

Lions Centre/Community Centre - The Lions Centre will be closed for the winter on Nov 15th. After another inspection in March it will be decided if it can re-open in April. During the closure the Legion have graciously offered to host Lions events there. Please still book with Tanya and then she will coordinate the dates with Vance. The stream table will be moved from the Lions Centre to the kitchen upstairs at the Legion. HRM will cover the heat/lights and plowing during the winter.

The Lions Centre was our Comfort Centre in cause of severe storms this needs to be addressed since the Centre will be closed.

The design for the new school will be going out for tender by the end of November. The Community Consultation Committee will be travelling to South Queens to look at a school there that we may model.

Bridget Boutilier and David Hendsbee should be contacted to ask for suggestions as to what that Chamber should do next regarding enhancements to the new school.
